Generating Static at the Speed of Two:

two bibs, one made of polyester and wool felt, the other of bubble wrap, polyester felt and dot matrix LCD screens. The LCD screens display random animations when statically charged. A pair of users wear the bibs, rubbing against each other's target dots, and are rewarded with a visual generated by their static attraction.
