Juried by Pamela Callahan, The Midwest Open is an annual exhibition at WMG that highlights the achievements of women and nonbinary artists living in the American Midwest. Included were artists from Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Wisconsin, Iowa, Minnesota, Missouri, and South Dakota.

**Juror Statement:** "In preparing to view the artwork submitted for Woman Made Gallery's 7th Midwest Open, I was curious: What's happening, visual-art-wise, in mid-America, America, the World in 2024? I pledged to be open to the answer. Open to art that spanned genres, materials and motivations. And to find what opened further. The breadth of concerns explored here, with such wit and intensity, whimsy and rigor, was thrilling. Here is expanse and intimacy. Here are the questions that flower questions. And what's best—here is humor.

I am most thrilled by the force and the freedom of that! What came together for this exhibition is the wide view that comes when one is focused on well-crafted work. These artists regard themselves and the world with compassion and scrutiny. They bring their findings to bear in paint and cloth and all the ways we make our light. It's a hope-filled exhibition.
